What problems did you encounter?

How do you hold the students accountable for meaningful discussions?

OSit in on discussions

• Give "points" for thoughtful contributions (a la "Around the Horn" for you ESPN fans...)

ORecognize group "winners"

• Randomly select a group to share their discussion and/or role work with the class

What if a group member doesn't show up?

• Not typically a problem for the group to still have a meaningful discussion

OAward a grade based on written work AND inclass participation

Can you do Reading Roles with a large class?*

OAssign groups/roles alphabetically

OCreate role partners (e.g., two creative connectors) and have larger groups (10-12)

OAssign groups to "present" their roles to the class for only one reading/topic during the semester

How do you get students to think critically about their roles?

O INCENTIVIZE!!

- Award grades based on thoughtfulness and/or critical analysis of written work
- O Create a "role competition"
 - For example, all the creative connectors share their connections and the "winner" is determined by the class (e.g., Poll Everywhere)
